Addiction Assistance Service

Offers a 24-hour toll-free line to help those persons who are in need of assistance with their own addiction or to help those persons who have been affected by the addictions of others. All calls are answered by professionally trained staff who can answer questions and guide the caller to the right service-provider.

Westover Treatment Centre

Offers a 21 day residential program for people suffering from alcohol or drug addiction or both.

A weekend program and 7 day residential program for family and friends of the alcoholic or drug dependent person is also provided.

Westover offers a variety of outpatient programs as well. Westover programs are open to men and women over 16 years of age.

Westover offers a Senior's program designed to improve the quality of life for seniors who misuse alcohol or drugs, and their families.


Offers three programs:

- 1) Outpatient Program - includes assessment, treatment or referral for Chatham-Kent residents experiencing a substance abuse problem.
- 2) Youth Program - An outpatient program including assessment treatment or referral services for youth under 21 experiencing substance abuse problems.
- 3) Gambling Addiction Program - to provide outpatient assessment and treatment for people who have problem gambling behaviours.
